Organising Authority (OA) is Draycote Water Sailing Club in conjunction with Blaze class association

NOTICE OF RACE

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of the rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1. This event is governed by the rules as defined in *the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028*.
- 1.2. Competitors shall sail in accordance with the [RYA Racing Charter](#).
- 1.3. Competitors must abide by the [RYA anti-doping policy](#).
- 1.4. Standard Class rules apply.
- 1.5. [DP] Rule 40.1 applies at all times when afloat.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTION

- 2.1. The sailing instructions will be available electronically after 30/09/2026 at <https://draycotewater.co.uk/events/blaze-open-2026/>

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1. The official notice board will be online at <https://draycotewater.co.uk/events/blaze-open-2026/>
- 3.2. Useful information may also be relayed via a WhatsApp group, set up using mobile numbers from entry forms, however this will not be used for official notifications.
- 3.3. [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 4.1. The event is open to all Fire and Blaze boats sailed by members of the Blaze Class Association.
- 4.2. It will **not** be possible to join Blaze Class Association at the event. BCA membership must be completed online at <https://www.blaze-sailing.org/plans-pricing> by 23:59 on Wednesday 30th September to be eligible for a race result.

- 4.3. Any Fire entry will be scored as a Blaze in the main results and separate Fire results posted.
- 4.4. Entrants are to declare their sail type as either Fire or Blaze at registration. The sail type registered shall not be changed throughout the event.
- 4.5. Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration at <https://webcollect.org.uk/mydwsc/event/online-registration-for-open-meetings-hosted-at-dwsc> and paying the required fees by 23:59 on 29th September 26
- 4.6. Late entries may be accepted at the OA's discretion up to 23:59 on 1st October 26. These will be subject to £10 surcharge.
- 4.7. Entries are limited to 100.
- 4.8. [DP] An online disclaimer must be completed before launching for each visiting boat to state that the Check, Clean, Dry programme has been observed.
- 4.9. All boats shall sail under their register numbers to comply with RRS 77. Under exceptional circumstances a boat may be permitted to carry sail numbers or letters in contravention of her class rules provided that written application, stating the circumstances, is made to the Race Committee prior to the 1st race. If such permission is granted no further change will be permitted.
- 4.10. By submitting an entry for this event all sailors declare understanding and acceptance of the Risk Statement in NOR 17 as agreed by the Race Committee.
- 4.11. The regatta forms part of the Blaze Traveler Series, details of which can be found on the Blaze Class Association website <https://www.blaze-sailing.org/blazetravellerseries>

5. FEES

- 5.1. The entry fee is £65. Ladies and sailors age 26 and under at the time of the event are to receive a 50% reduction on the cost of entry.
- 5.2. If the event is cancelled by the OA a refund less any costs incurred will be issued.
- 5.3. If a competitor cancels within 7 days of the event no refund will be given. Before 7 days 80% refund will be given.

6. ADVERTISING

- 6.1. [DP] Boats maybe required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

7.3. Racing:

The event will consist of up to 6 races.

7.4. On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15.00

7.5. The start time for any race may be brought forward or postponed in order that the Schedule can be maintained should the wind/weather forecast suggest unfavourable conditions for racing. The Race Officer's decision to race is the sole and final decision.

7.6. The intention is that Regatta races will continue for approximately 45 minutes. The Race Committee may choose to use Flag W for those boats failing to finish in a reasonable time after the first boat finishes. Such boats will have their positions taken and asked to return straight to the committee boat ready for the next race. They will score their position within the fleet even though they did not complete the course. This changes RRS 35 and A5.1 and A5.2.

8. EQUIPMENT INSPECTIONS

8.1. Boats and equipment may be inspected for rules compliance at any time.

9. VENUE

9.1. The venue is Draycote Water Sailing Club, Draycote Water, CV23 8AB.

9.2. The sailing area will be Draycote Water.

10. COURSES

10.1. The course will be Triangle/ Sausage, Inverted P or Trapezoid

10.2. Full details will be in the sailing instruction.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1. Appendix T will apply.

12.SCORING

- 12.1. One race shall constitute an event
- 12.2. If 4 or fewer races have been completed a boats score shall be the total of her race scores
- 12.3. If more than 4 races have been completed a boats score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her one worst score.RRS 90.3(e) applies.

13.SUPPORT VESSELS

- 13.1. Support boats will not be allowed.

14.CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

- 14.1. The venue does not have boats for hire for this event.

15.BERTHING.

- 15.1. [DP] Boats shall be stored in the boat park or boat drop off areas as directed by marshals and/or signs.

16.DATA PROTECTION

16.1.Results,

As part of entering this event your results will be published in the public domain and may be given to the RYA for their Portsmouth Yardstick scheme and to the Class Association. While your results contain personal data, it is normal practice to expect that, when entering an event, your results will be published, and this is a condition of entry. It is therefore part of the contract to provide you with race entry and administration that we will publish the results, which may include such information such as sail number, sailing club, age and gender (if there are age and gender related results).

16.2. Photography,

By competing in this event, competitors grant to the organisers without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any non-identifiable motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event and consent to these being published in class, club, sponsor and other publications and / or the class, club, sponsor or other websites.

17.RISK STATEMENT

- 17.1.Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."
Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.
- 17.2.By taking part in the event, each competitor (and parent/guardian for under 18's) agrees and acknowledges that:
 - 17.2.1.They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - 17.2.2.They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their property whether afloat or ashore;
 - 17.2.3.They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;

- 17.2.4. It is the responsibility of the competitors and/ or supervising adults to ensure personal hygiene standards are maintained such as showering and hand washing to limit the risk of water born illnesses such as blue green algae and Weills disease.
- 17.2.5. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 17.2.6. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 17.2.7. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- 17.2.8. It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any competitors briefing held for the event.
- 17.2.9. The organising authority will not accept any liability for loss, material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

18.INSURANCE

- 18.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

19.PRIZES

- 19.1. Prizes will be awarded as in 24.3 at prize giving located on the Bar asap after the final race of the final day.
- 19.2. Additional Prizes may be awarded at the OA's discretion.
